

MySQL command line - quick tips

From Bash

Login (localhost access)

```
mysql -u <userid> -p
```

From the MySQL command prompt

List all databases on the current server

```
mysql> show databases;
```

Switch to a database

```
mysql> use <db name>;
```

Show all tables in the currently selected database

```
mysql> show tables;
```

View a table's schema

```
mysql> describe <table name>;
```

Issue a select statement (example)

```
mysql> select * from <table name>;
```

Limit number of rows returned in a select

(TOP doesn't work in MySQL...)

```
mysql> select * from <table name> limit 0,10;
```
